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**HB 23 by Eagle, Gruters**

**Public Assistance;** Revises penalties for noncompliance with work requirements for temporary cash assistance; limits receipt of child-only benefits during periods of noncompliance with work requirements; provides applicability of work requirements before expiration of minimum penalty period; requires DCF to refer sanctioned participants to appropriate community services; requires DEO, in cooperation with CareerSource Florida, Inc., & DCF, to develop & implement work plan agreement for participants in temporary cash assistance program; requires DCF to impose replacement fee for EBT cards; revises eligibility guidelines for Relative Caregiver Program with respect to relative & nonrelative caregivers; provides appropriation. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 25 by McGhee**

**Annual Sales Tax Holiday for Veterans of the United States Armed Forces;** Creates annual sales tax holiday for veterans of US Armed Forces; specifies items eligible for sales tax holiday; specifies tax treatment of layaways, exchanges, & Internet sales; provides definitions; specifies reporting requirements of retailers; authorizes DOR to adopt emergency rules. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 27 by McGhee, Jenne**

**Florida Slavery Memorial;** Establishes Florida Slavery Memorial; provides for administration of memorial by DMS; provides conditions for construction & placement of memorial. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 29 by McGhee**

**Specialty License Plates;** Directs DHSMV to develop National Pan-Hellenic Council Sorority or Fraternity license plates. Effective Date: October 1, 2017

**HB 31 by Jones, S.**

**Background Screening;** Prohibits employers from excluding applicant from initial interview for employment under certain conditions; provides applicability; provides exceptions; requires DEO to enforce act. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HJR 33 by Jenne** (Similar SJR 338)

**Real Property Rights of Aliens Ineligible for Citizenship;** Proposes amendment to s. 2, Art. I of State Constitution to delete provision authorizing the Legislature to regulate or prohibit ownership, inheritance, disposition, & possession of real property by aliens who are ineligible for citizenship.

**HB 35 by Jenne** (Compare SB 98, SJR 108)

**Well Stimulation Treatments;** Prohibits well stimulation treatments for exploration or production of oil or natural gas. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 37 by Jones, S.**

**Law Enforcement Certification;** Requires law enforcement & correctional officers to pass job-related psychological evaluation performed by mental health professional before initial employment or appointment & every 4 years as condition of continued employment or appointment; requires all criminal justice training schools to receive specified national accreditation by certain date. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 39 by Jenne** (Similar SB 154, Compare HB 219)

**Autism Awareness Training for Law Enforcement Officers;** Requires FDLE to establish continued employment training component relating to autism spectrum disorder; specifies instruction to be included. Effective Date: October 1, 2017

**HB 41 by Jenne**

**Legislative Apportionment and Congressional Redistricting;** Creates independent commission on legislative apportionment & congressional redistricting; provides for purpose, duties, membership, & funding of commission; requires commission to conduct public hearings; subjects commission to government-in-the-sunshine & financial disclosure requirements; prohibits persons not serving on or employed by commission from influencing or attempting to influence commission members & employees other than through prescribed processes; provides criminal penalties. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 43 by Watson, B.**

**Special Review Commission;** Creates Special Review Commission; provides for commission membership; specifies membership requirements; requires law enforcement agencies to report lethal use-of-force incidents to commission; requires prosecutors to notify commission of inquiries into use-of-force fatalities & determinations not to pursue charges; authorizes commission to review lethal use-of-force incidents; authorizes commission to refer incidents to AG for prosecution consideration; authorizes commission to subpoena documents & witnesses; authorizes AG to bring criminal charges; prohibits actions that could constitute double jeopardy. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HM 45 by Watson, B.**

**Haitian American Heritage Month;** Urges Congress to recognize month of May as "Haitian American Heritage Month."

**HB 47 by Stark, Slosberg**

**Texting While Driving;** Revises penalties for violations of Florida Ban on Texting While Driving Law; provides enhanced penalties for such violations when committed in school zone or school crossing; removes requirement that specified provisions be enforced as secondary action by law enforcement agency. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

Transportation & Infrastructure Subcommittee; Transportation & Tourism Appropriations Subcommittee; Government Accountability Committee

**HB 49 by Eagle (Similar SB 272)**

**Ad Valorem Taxation;** Requires property appraisers to reduce the assessed value on residential property damaged or destroyed by natural disaster under certain conditions; requiring the property appraiser to submit written statement to the tax collector & specifying the contents thereof; provides duties of tax collector relating to reduction in taxes; requires annual notification to DOR & board of county commissioners of reduction in taxes; provides retroactive applicability; provides effective date. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**HJR 51 by Watson, C. (Identical SJR 270)**

**Restoration of Civil Rights;** Proposes amendment to State Constitution to authorize Legislature to prescribe additional circumstances under which certain fines & forfeitures may be suspended or remitted, reprieves may be granted, civil rights may be restored, & punishments may be commuted.

**HB 53 by Watson, C. (Compare SJR 270)**

**Restoration of Civil Rights;** Designates act as "Restoration of Civil Rights Act"; provides for automatic restoration of former felon's civil rights, other than right to own, possess, or use firearms, following completion of sentence of incarceration & community supervision;

provides conditions for & exemptions from automatic restoration; provides for education concerning civil rights of people who have felony convictions; provides retroactive applicability; provides for contingent effect. Effective Date: on the effective date of HJR 51

**HB 55 by Burgess, Fant (Similar SB 326)**

**Alternative Treatment Options for Veterans;** Authorizes DVA to contract with certain individuals & entities to provide alternative treatment options for certain veterans; requires direction & supervision by certain licensed providers; authorizes DVA to adopt rules. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 57 by Porter, Combee, Hahnfeldt (Compare SB 70)**

**Crimes Evidencing Prejudice;** Provides for enhancement of penalties for certain offenses if commission of offense evidences prejudice based on victim's employment as justice or judge, correctional officer or correctional probation officer, or first responder. Effective Date: October 1, 2017

**HB 59 by Pigman (Similar SB 58)**

**Adult Cardiovascular Services;** Expands rulemaking criteria for AHCA for licensure of hospitals performing percutaneous cardiac intervention procedures. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 61 by Lee, Berman**

**Emergency Services for an Unintentional Drug Overdose;** Requires hospital providing emergency services to person suffering from unintentional drug overdose to provide certain services & information; provides conditions for patient transfer to licensed detoxification or addictions receiving facility; provides attending physician responsibilities; provides conditions under which person who suffers unintentional drug overdose & seeks emergency services & care may not be charged, prosecuted, or penalized for specified offenses. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 63 by Edwards, Plasencia (Similar SB 176)**

**Tax Exemption for Feminine Hygiene Products;** Exempts from sales & use tax sale of feminine hygiene products; defines term "feminine hygiene product." Effective Date: January 1, 2018

**HB 65 by Fischer, White**

**Civil Remedies for Terrorism;** Creates cause of action relating to terrorism; specifies measure of damages; prohibits claims by specified individuals; provides for attorney fees & court costs; provides construction. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 67 by Plasencia, Cortes, B., Davis, Duran, Fant, Gruters, Jenne, Miller, M.** (Identical SB 78)

**Public School Recess;** Requires district school board to provide K-5 students with minimum number of minutes of free-play recess each week & minimum number of consecutive minutes of free-play recess per day. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

PreK-12 Innovation Subcommittee; PreK-12 Appropriations Subcommittee; Education Committee

**HB 69 by Slosberg, Baez** (Identical SB 144)

**Use of Wireless Communications Devices while Driving;** Provides for primary enforcement of Florida Ban on Texting While Driving Law for drivers age 18 or younger; requires deposit of fines into Emergency Medical Services Trust Fund. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 71 by Cruz** (Similar SB 252)

**Tax Exemption for Personal Hygiene Products;** Exempts from sales & use tax sale of diapers & baby wipes. Effective Date: January 1, 2018

**HB 73 by Beshears** (Compare SB 368)

**Transportation Facility Designations;** Designates SP4 Robert Clifford Millender Memorial Highway in Franklin County & Joe C. Peavy Highway in Madison County; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 75 by Slosberg**

**Victim Assistance;** Requires law enforcement agency to provide specified information to victim if victim's property is located in pawnshop Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 77 by Avila** (Identical SB 122)

**Sports Franchise Facilities;** Prohibits professional or semi-professional sports franchise from constructing, reconstructing, renovating, or improving facility on leased public land; requires that sale of public land for sports franchise facility be at fair market value. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

Government Accountability Committee; Appropriations Committee

**HB 79 by Harrell**

**Education;** Revises duties of Just Read, Florida! Office relating to reading instruction, training, & research; revises data & monitoring requirements for school improvement plans & early warning systems; revises parent notification requirements relating to students with reading deficiencies; revises requirements & standards for teacher training & professional certificates & endorsements; requires OEL to identify guidelines for reading instruction strategies; revises requirements & criteria for remediation & identification of students with reading deficiencies; revises reporting requirements relating to school improvement & accountability; revises requirements for instructional materials funds; revises duties of school districts relating to professional development. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**HB 81 by Avila** (Similar SB 106)

**Vendors Licensed Under the Beverage Law;** Repeals provisions relating to restrictions on sale by certain licensed alcoholic beverage vendors of merchandise other than specifically authorized types of merchandise & restrictions on direct access to such vendor's place of business; provides exception from employment restrictions on vendors licensed under Beverage Law for employment of persons under specified age; provides that failure to comply with restriction on monthly revenue from sale of alcoholic beverages is unlawful if minor is employed during month that restriction is exceeded, to which penalties apply. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 83 by Eagle** (Similar SB 120)

**Offenses by Illegal Immigrants;** Requires specified offenses to be reclassified if committed by an illegal immigrant. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 85 by Slosberg** (Identical SB 148)

**Students Remaining on School Grounds During School Hours;** Provides short title; authorizes district school boards to adopt policies permitting students to leave school grounds during lunch period; prohibits schools in certain districts from permitting students to leave school grounds during lunch period without prior written parental consent. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

PreK-12 Quality Subcommittee; PreK-12 Appropriations Subcommittee; Education Committee

**HJR 87 by Diaz, M.** (Identical SJR 136, Compare HJR 187, SJR 130, SJR 132, SJR 134, SJR 138)

**Selection and Duties of County Officers;** Proposes amendment to State Constitution to remove authority for county charter to specify method for choosing certain county officers; prohibit special law from specifying method for choosing property appraiser; requiring county voter approval to abolish a county office & transfer duties; removes authority for county charter to transfer certain duties of the clerk of circuit court.

Withdrawn prior to introduction

**HB 89 by Cortes, J.** (Similar HB 137)

**Homeowners' Associations;** Authorizes certain disputes to be submitted to mandatory binding arbitration with division; requires HOA to impose fees for certain purposes. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

Withdrawn prior to introduction

**HB 91 by Cortes, J.**

**State Housing Tax Credit Program;** Requiring a minimum allocation be appropriated to State Housing Tax Credit Program each fiscal year. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 93 by Richardson, Slosberg** (Similar SB 162)

**Disposable Plastic Bags;** Authorizes certain municipalities to establish pilot programs to regulate or ban disposable plastic bags; provides program criteria; provides for program expiration; directs participating municipalities to collect data & submit reports to municipal governing bodies & DEP; defines term "coastal community." Effective Date: July 1, 2017

Local, Federal & Veterans Affairs Subcommittee; Careers & Competition Subcommittee; Government Accountability Committee

**HB 95 by Massullo, Goodson, Grant, M., Jenne, La Rosa, Miller, A., Plasencia** (Similar SB 182)

**Consumer Protection from Nonmedical Changes to Prescription Drug Formularies;** Limits changes to prescription drug formularies during health insurance policy or HMO contract year; provides applicability; requires small employer carriers to provide continuity of care with respect to prescription drug coverage. Effective Date: January 1, 2018

**HB 97 by Pigman** (Identical SB 164)

**Certificates of Title for Motor Vehicles;** Prohibits DHSMV from charging fee for certificate of title issued for motor vehicle solely to remove deceased joint owner if other joint owner is surviving spouse. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

Transportation & Infrastructure Subcommittee; Transportation & Tourism Appropriations Subcommittee; Government Accountability Committee

**HB 99 by Jones, S.**

**Internship Tax Credit Program;** Authorizes corporate income tax credit of up to specified amount for degree-seeking student hired by certain businesses after internship by student; provides eligibility criteria; authorizes DOR to adopt rules governing applications & establish qualification requirements; authorizes business to carry forward tax credit for specified period. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

Post-Secondary Education Subcommittee; Ways & Means Committee; Education Committee

**HB 101 by Cortes, B., Burgess, Plakon**

**Certificates of Nonviable Birth;** Creates "Grieving Families Act"; authorizes State Registrar of Vital Statistics Office of DOH to electronically receive certificate of nonviable birth; requires DOH to issue certificate of nonviable birth upon request of specified parent; authorizes rulemaking by DOH. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

Health Quality Subcommittee; Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee; Health & Human Services Committee

**HB 103 by Cortes, B.**

**Public Records/Nonviable Birth Records;** Provides that certain information included in nonviable birth records is confidential & exempt from public records requirements; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: on the same date that HB 101 or similar legislation takes effect

**HB 105 by Cruz**

**Vote-By-Mail Ballots;** Requires supervisor to allow submission of an affidavit to cure signature discrepancies on vote-by-mail ballot. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 107 by Cortes, B.**

**Disturbing the Contents of a Grave or Tomb;** Provides exceptions to prohibition on disturbing contents of grave or tomb for relocations in certain circumstances by cemeteries that are exempt from regulation & for relocations due to declared natural disasters. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HCR 109 by Baez, Geller, Jenne** (Similar SCR 194)

**Equal Rights for Men and Women;** Ratifies proposed amendment to U.S. Constitution relating to equal rights for men & women.

Public Integrity & Ethics Committee; Judiciary Committee; Rules & Policy Committee

**HB 111 by Stafford**

**Public Records/Identity of Witness to a Murder;** Provides exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information of witness to murder for specified period; authorizes specified entities to receive information; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides that public records exemption applies to personal identifying information of witness to murder that is made part of court file; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 113 by Miller, A.**

**Greyhound Racing;** Provides that positive test result for anabolic steroids in greyhound results in violation. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 115 by Russell** (Identical SB 218)

**Cable and Video Service Agreements;** Requires service agreements to specify in the agreements whether such agreements will be automatically renewed under specified circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

Energy & Utilities Subcommittee; Civil Justice & Claims Subcommittee; Commerce Committee

**HB 117 by Willhite**

**Voting System Audits;** Requires certain entities responsible for election certification to conduct audit of voting systems before certifying election; requires entities to certify election immediately following completion of audit. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 119 by Donalds**

**Interscholastic Extracurricular Activities;** Authorizes charter school student to participate in interscholastic extracurricular activities at private school under certain circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HJR 121 by Gonzalez**

**Legislative Review of Judicial Ruling Declaring a Legislative Act Void;** Proposes creation of s. 22 of Art. III of State Constitution to provide for legislative review of judicial ruling declaring a legislative act void.

**HB 123 by Porter**

**Transportation Facility Designations;** Designates Historic Suwannee River Scenic Parkway in Hamilton and Suwannee Counties; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HM 125 by Gonzalez**

**Federal Court Rulings;** Urges U.S. Congress to propose to states amendment to U.S. Constitution that allows Congress to deem law that has been declared void by certain federal courts active & operational.

**HB 127 by Plasencia**

**Public School Attendance Policies;** Authorizes parent to request & be granted permission for student absence from school for treatment of autism spectrum disorder; requires district school board to adopt attendance policy authorizing absence for treatment of autism spectrum disorder; revises exemption relating to parental responsibility for nonattendance of student. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 129 by Plasencia** (Compare SB 96)

**Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioners;** Revises definition of term "medical director" to include certain advanced registered nurse practitioners; authorizes advanced registered nurse practitioners to sign, certify, stamp, verify, or endorse document that requires signature, certification, stamp, verification, or endorsement of physician. Effective Date: July 1, 2017

**HB 131 by Cortes, J., Massullo**
